TASK 1: Look back at your story plan focusing on Section 5:End

1) Opening - Miss Hemswell is taking her class on a trip to a history museum - she is excited as she really loves History!


2) Build-up - Finds a model of a knight - she tells the children about medieval times - as she is walking away the model comes to life + grabs her hand - pulls her back
