

Activity 1 – Weekly spellings


Can you write each of these words into a sentence?

You have already done some work on the picture including answering some questions and a 'sentence challenge'.




Today and tomorrow we are going to make some 'sick sentences' better and you are also going to finish the story about Lawrence.




Activity 3:

SICK SENTENCE: There had been a crash.



That's a bit boring! We can do better than that!

Let's add an adverb.



Unfortunately there had been a crash.

That's much better.
Let's improve the description of the crash.



Unfortunately there had been a nasty, horrible crash.

I like the double adjectives!





I think we need an adverbial for time.

Unfortunately, there had been a nasty, horrible crash early in the evening.



I like the adverbial that tells me when the crash happened.




Here is our improved sentence!
It is GREAT!

Unfortunately, there had been a nasty, horrible crash early in the evening.

Wow! We've made the sick sentence better!

EXTENSION TASK

Did you know that on this day in 1969 that the Apollo 11 was launched.

Apollo 11 carried Neil Armstrong, Buzz Aldrin and Tim Collins and it was the first mission that reached and landed on our moon.
