#### **Nut-free school**



## Introducing Lincolnshire's Stay Safe Partnership & SnapChat (13+)

For those who have been reading my Top Tips in previous years, you'll know that I'm a big fan of the Lincolnshire Stay Safe Partnership. In their own words, the Stay Safe Partnership (SSP) ... 'provides a single point of access to education programmes that are designed to help keep children and young people safe; delivering resources and workshops for education provisions in Lincolnshire from early years to college'. Every year, we invite the SSP in to deliver age-group tailored e-safety workshops to our children. More information can be found by searching for them online; they also provide support for parents and carers.

This week's Top Tip comes in the form of an information poster for parents and carers about Snapchat.
