Our School Week

You will often hear myself, our staff and the children talk about the 5Rs. These are the values and principles we believe that if children become proficient in then they

will grow to be better people and citizens of the world. Everything we do in school from learning in classrooms, to team sports, school visits and sports day are all building towards embedding the 5Rs within our children's actions and thought processes. In this bulletin I will demonstrate this by adding each of these values to the entries below. The 'monsters' all have names related to the 5Rs and this helps children with a visual cue as well as understanding the words.

Our School Week

This week has been a very busy week in school. We started our week in assembly learning about harvest and reflecting on what this looks like in the world today. WE of course looked at foods, both foods grown locally but also foods that come to our country from around the world. We also looked at how this time of celebration is also a time where we can support families and people who are in a less fortunate position and so we reflected upon food banks why they are there and who might use them. Social Media guides for parents and carers

Many thanks to the parents and carers who were able to come into school last week to talk to teachers about different ways in which to support their children.

One of the leaflets I was handing out to parents on this occasion was a 'social media guide for parents & carers'; this guide details the age rating for different apps and the reasons why these age ratings have been determined. Of particular note, the majority of social media apps have an age rating above that of the age of children at primary school, often due to child-protection risks (which are explained within the guide).
